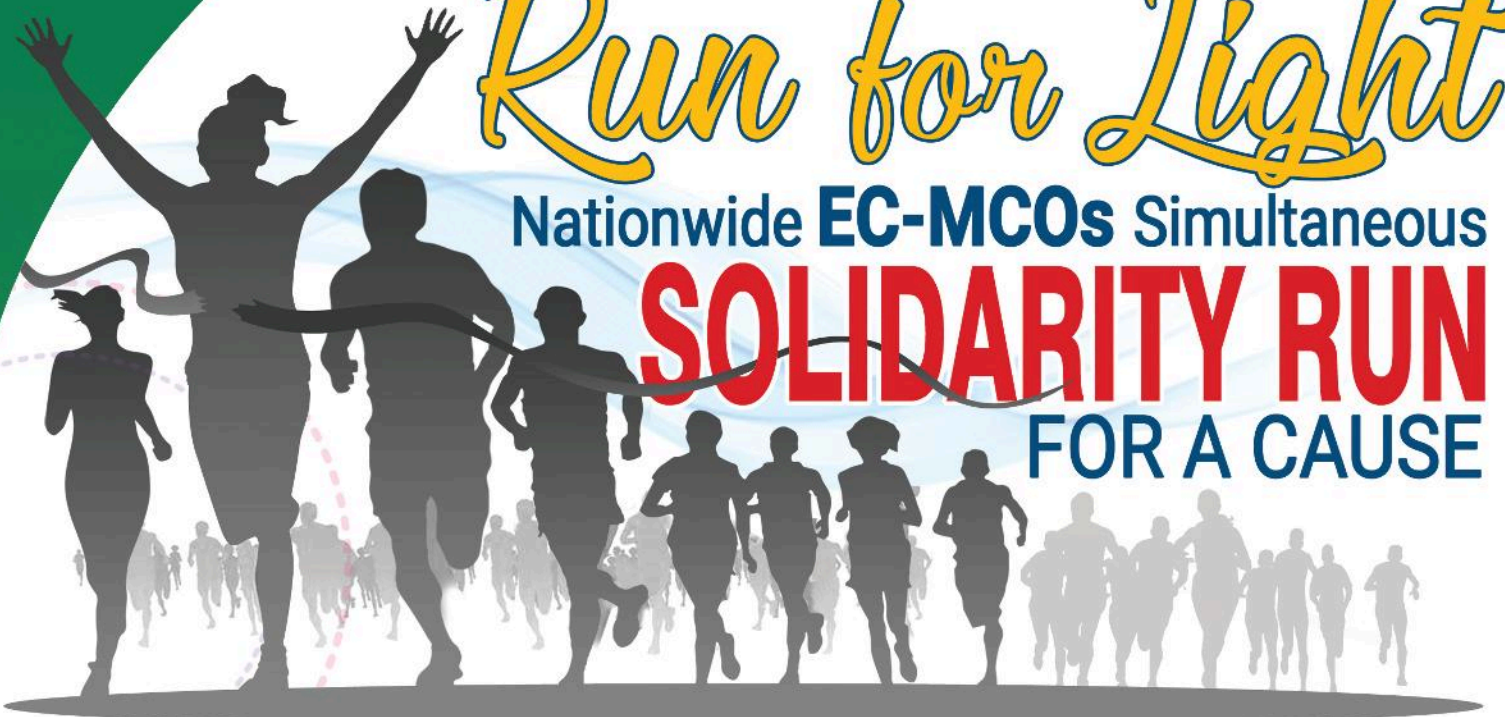

Approved on 28 July 1969, the State policy of total electrification on an area coverage service basis was declared through RA No. 6038 or the National Electrification Administration Act, it provided for the organization of the National Electrification Administration (NEA) and the organization, promotion and development of Electric Cooperatives (ECs). Geared toward empowering and strengthening the NEA in the promotion of sustainable development in the rural areas through rural electrification with the ECs as its implementing arm.

The partnership of NEA and the ECs in the last five decades proved its vital role in shaping the socio-economic landscape of the countryside that provided the rural folks-the EC Member-Consumer-Owners (MCOs) with the best opportunities for better, more comfortable life through a reliable, safe, efficient and affordable electricity service.
