ASSOCIATIONS FOR TROPICAL DEPRESSION ODETTE

This is regarding Tropical Depression "Odette", which is expected to landfall and traverse the landmass and coastal waters of Northern and Central Mindanao including the CARAGA Region, Eastern, Central and Western Visayas Regions, MIMAROPA and could also affect neighboring regions from December 14-18, 2021, based on the Tropical Cyclone Bulletin issued by PAGASA.

In anticipation on the onslaught and possible damage of Tropical Depression Odette to distribution lines and facilities that may be affected, the NEA is advising all electric cooperatives and EC Regional Associations to prepare for any eventuality and activate EC's Emergency Response Plan and Task Force Kapatid (TFK) contingent.

If in any case assistance is determined for the ECs that were badly affected by the said tropical depression, it is suggested that the first wave of the Task Force Kapatid should be within its region. And as the need arises, the second wave should be coming from its neighboring regions and so on until it suffices the required workforce for the immediate restoration of electric service to the affected consumers. The ECs' respective TFK should be ready to respond and can be deployed at any moment when requested upon.

Also, please inform NEA of any response and/or action that your respective ECs and Regional Associations will be undertaken about the deployment TFK for our guidance.
