SUBJECT : Contingency Plans in the Event of a Power Supply Deficit



With Indonesia's recent imposition banning the exportation of coal to other countries for the month of January 2022, our country's energy supply is foreseen to be adversely affected since nearly half of our electricity is generated by coal-fired power plants. Domestic mines supply about 25 percent of our coal requirements, with the remaining 75 percent being imported from other countries wherein 97 percent of which is sourced from Indonesia.

To mitigate the ill-effects of the possible shortage of coal supply in the country, all electric cooperatives (ECs) with existing Power Supply Agreements (PSAs) with coal-fired generation plants are advised to coordinate with their respective power suppliers for their compliance to the 30-day minimum inventory requirement and contingency plans in the event of a power supply deficit to prevent widespread power outages.

In addition, all ECs are required to submit their Business Continuity Plan (BCP) to avert power supply shortage in their franchise areas. Furthermore, the conduct of Information, Education, and Communication (IEC) Workshop on Energy Efficiency and Conservation to spread awareness amongst the member-consumer-owners (MCOs) is strongly advised.
